RDA in MODS

A bit about MODS:

- “Metadata Object Description Schema” – developed by Library of Congress (current version 3.3)
- XML syntax, with textual element tags (verbose but arguably more human readable than MARC)
- Extensible description capability (often described as a “happy medium” between Dublin Core and MARC)
- Can describe related entities as “children” of the top level entity (here, Manifestation) with fully fleshed-out “records”, or as linking identifiers

Disclaimers and benefits:

- Official RDA to MODS mapping not yet published (though under development and forthcoming soon)
- A proof-of-concept mock-up: one cataloger’s realization
- No attempt is made to emulate the look and feel of a MARC record
- ISBD punctuation between elements could be machine supplied, and is not given here
- Since top-level elements can appear as children of instances of <relatedItem>, related items can be described with varying levels of robustness (per RDA, as an identifier, controlled access point or textual description)
- This example displays features of all three of these levels; in a real-life implementation scenario, likely only one would be used consistently
- Use of an identifier (URI) to refer to a related manifestation (here, the source of the reprint) could preclude the need to describe the content of the resource, if such content were adequately described in the context of the original manifestation
- Related persons, corporate bodies, concepts, etc. can be given within the proper level of the hierarchy (within the respective Work or Expression record), rather than at the top level where these relationships are not machine readable
