

# Comparing RDA and AACR2 in MARC

<b>Description of Differences</b>
The RDA record uses the punctuation conventions of ISBD.
The RDA record indicates the standard used in the cataloging. For this exercise, a fictional code (rda) was used to indicate that RDA was used in the cataloging.
RDA does not make use of the GMD. Instead the designation is broken up into 3 parts: media type (3.2), carrier type (3.3), and content type (6.10). MARC will be implementing fields 336, 337, and 338 to account for this. I have used existing MARC fields 007a and 007b for media type and carrier type respectively and the 336 for content type in this record.
In the AACR2 record, two of the statements of responsibility are bracketed because they were taken outside the chief source of information (i.e. the title screens). In RDA, brackets (or other means of indicating supplied data) are only used when the information is taken from outside the resource itself.
The label suggested that the sound had a phonogram copyright date of 2002 and that the film was copyright 1988. The packaging was copyright 2002. According to current practice, only a supplied date was the correct course of action. RDA makes clear that if no publication date is present, one is to record the date of copyright, defined as including copyright and phonogram copyright dates. Furthermore, RDA dictates that if multiple copyright dates are present, even if they pertain to different aspects of the resource, to record the latest date of copyright. However, RDA makes no mention of what to record if the copyright and phonogram copyright date are the same. In my view, I felt that the phonogram copyright date was more important than the packaging copyright date, so a phonogram copyright date of 2002 was recorded.
The use of "p" or "c" is no longer allowed in RDA. Only the symbols
(© or ®) or the full spelling of "copyright" or "phonogram" are allowed.
RDA does not specify that duration be record as part of the extent statement. This convention is also not present in ISBD.
"Sound" and "color" may not be abbreviated in RDA.
Metric measurements are preferred in RDA. An alternative in 3.5.1.3 exists that allows dimensions to be recorded in the system of

538	RDA specifies that a video on DVD be specified as DVD video. No such requirement exists in AACR2.
500 (note on publication details)	see the discussion above in 260c pertaining to copyright and phonogram copyright symbols
500 (duration)	The convention in AACR2 to record a single statement of duration in the physical description (i.e. 300a) is not a convention of ISBD, so I have decided to record is as a note. However, examples in RDA Appendix M still place the duration in 300a.
500 (accompanying material, structured description)	RDA specifies the use of a term indicating the relationship between a work etc. and another work etc. Furthermore, if the description of the work etc. is structured, RDA requires the use of a term in Appendix J. In this case, the term "accompanied by" was chosen.
500 (accompanying material)	"Pages" and "illustrated" may not be abbreviated in RDA.
700 (first instance in RDA record)	RDA specifies that the Creator must be recorded. In this case Strauss is one of the creators. Past practice dictated that Strauss did not have to be recorded as a personal name added entry, since he appeared in conjunction with the title as a related work.
Relator codes (\$4)	RDA recommends recording a Relationship designator, defining the role a person, family, or corporate body played in the work, expression, or manifestation. This term is to be taken from Appendix I. In the RDA record I have used coding in \$4 in the 700 fields to indicate the relationship. Past practice for musical performers was to only record "prf". RDA leaves it up to the cataloger as to how specific the term should be.
