

## MARC Agenda Item: 7.b. MAC Proposal Ideas or Other MARC Change Requests

### i. 382 Subfield \$n redefinition question

**ISSUE:** DCM Z1 instructs us to include subfield \$n recording the number of ensembles after a medium term representing a standard combination of instruments or groups, e.g., orchestra, jazz ensemble, etc.

#### **From DCM Z1**

382. 1c) If the medium includes an uncertain number of performers, do not include \$n. If the medium term is that of a standard combination of instruments or group, e.g., orchestra, jazz ensemble, etc., include in subsequent subfield "n" the number of ensembles. For example, \$a orchestra \$n 1.

However, in the *Provisional Best Practices Using LCMPT* (not yet available), the instructions directly contradict Z1:

Do not record a numeral in subfield \$n after a medium from the ensemble hierarchy.

Medium of performance: solo viola with orchestra:  
382 01 \$b viola \$n 1 \$a orchestra \$2 lcmpt

Currently, 382 subfield \$n is defined as “Number of performers of the same medium” which seems to exclude using the coding for number of ensembles.

#### **OPTIONS:**

Option 1: Leave our recommendation as is, even if it directly contradicts the Z1 instructions.

Option 2: Redefine subfield \$n as “number of performers or ensembles of the same medium”

- Subfield \$n could be used for ensembles because it may be applicable.

#### **Examples: more than one ensemble** (contributed by Kimmy Szeto)

Thomas Tallis - Spem in alium - 4 mixed choruses

Spohr - Symphony Op.121 - 2 orchestras

Rainer Kunad - Concerto for organ, 2 string orchestras and timpani

- Redefining subfield \$n introduces ambiguity—what the number in \$n means would depend on whether the term it follows is an ensemble or not
- The consistent practice of coding subfield \$n after \$a, \$b, \$d, \$p may have implications on machine manipulation
